Assignment task

CW-1

Three academic exercises: (70 %):

500-word reflective essay, Using a recognised reflective model to structure your essay, identify one portfolio competency from the list provided . Reflect on your current ability in this area by considering how well you’ve performed in the past. Then, discuss how you plan to improve this skill going forward.

Your reflection should include:

- A brief description of the skill and why you chose it.
- Honest reflection on your past experiences with this skill — what went well, what didn't.
- Clear and realistic goals for how you will develop this skill going forward based around a SWOT analysis.

Use the reflective model as the main structure of your essay, however include elements addressed by your SWOT analysis within your writing.

- **Marked as a percentage- submit by the deadline**
- Maths Quiz, following engagement with the asynchronous paramedic numeracy content. Complete the maths quiz on blackboard. **100% required, but multiple attempts allowed**
- Blackboard referencing quiz **100% but multiple attempts**

Submitting

A Turnitin submission portal will be provided under the 'Submit your Assignment' tab on Blackboard 2 weeks before the deadline. It will be called "ALL4001 CW1". Any agreed extensions will be submitted through a second portal. You should aim to submit in plenty of time before the deadline. Please also note that work that is submitted after the deadline will be considered late. It is your responsibility to ensure you upload your work before the cut off time of 14:00, allowing for computer processing time. Late submissions will be marked and the actual mark recorded, but will be capped at the pass mark (typically 40%), provided that the work is of a passing standard, pending approval of mitigating circumstances. Work submitted over 10 days late will not be marked and will be treated as a non-submission. Work submitted via email will not be accepted nor marked.

Fit to Submit: Assignment Checklist



This brief **assignment checklist** is designed to help you avoid some of the most common mistakes students make in their coursework.

Have you read the assignment brief? If not, do so now!

- Have you kept to the word count (or equivalent)? If you are not sure, check with your tutor.
- Can you confirm that the work submitted is your own and maintains [academic integrity](#)?
