Text Type: Reflective poster with live presentation

Purpose: Demonstrate and explain application of clinical guidelines, legislation, and evidence.

Subject Matter: Emergency/urgent care presentations aligned to JRCALC guidelines

Students will design and present a digital academic poster that demonstrates detailed knowledge of the relevant legislation, clinical guidelines, protocols, and procedures for a selected urgent or emergency care presentation.

Each student will be allocated a specific clinical topic aligned to the JRCALC guidelines (e.g., asthma, COPD, ACS, angina, dyspnoea, headache, sepsis, limb trauma, pelvic injury). The poster must clearly explain the clinical approach to managing the condition, including reflecting on relevant clinical skills appropriate to Level 4 practice (e.g., oxygen administration, splinting).

Students must also demonstrate an understanding of the underpinning evidence base and legal frameworks that support the guideline, referencing current legislation, national policy, and reflecting on best practice and why it is important. Posters will be created digitally (e.g., using PowerPoint, Canva) and presented live to an academic audience. Students should be prepared to answer questions and justify their clinical decisions and evidence choices. This presentation should be allocated to 5 minutes per a student.

This assessment supports the development of professional communication, clinical reasoning, and evidence-informed practice.

- **Submission Method:** Posters must be submitted via the Turnitin portal on the VLE prior to the live presentation session. Submission deadlines will be confirmed in class and on the VLE.
